Confidence Corner John F. Board In this week's Confidence Corner we will examine some contrasts between the two times God allowed spies to go into the land He promised to give the Israelites. I hope that in doing so, we can learn

some of the lessons God may have intended from His preservation and revelation of these Old Testament events.

When the spies go into the land in Joshua they are neither named nor given specific credentials, unlike in Numbers 13. I think a close study of Numbers 13 and the names mentioned provides a sense in which the people should have trusted God to do as He had said (deliver the land to them).

Secondly, the spies, in their report, say or do nothing to assure Joshua that the task will succeed. In Numbers when they first have an opportunity to enter the land, their reliance was not on God.

How very different was the report of the spies who were sent to look over Jericho! They had said, 'Truly the Lord has delivered all the land into our hands' (2:24). Their confidence then was in God. I'm not certain all of the elements that provide this confidence, but it was something that was very good.

It is interesting though to note how quickly the Israelites forget that their confidence is in God. The Israelites, however, were brimming over with self-confidence and were inflated with pride at the victory at Jericho. They contemptuously regarded Ai as easy prey. 'The people of Ai are few,' they said. And just as when they placed their full trust in God, God provided them victory, when they began to trust in themselves they were defeated. We can learn from this and regard the inspired instruction in Proverbs 3:5-6.

May God provide the increase as we are faithful to the task He has asked us to fulfill that He may be glorified!
