I do not know that I would trade what I have with my girls today, but that does not mean that I do not also remember very fondly the times when they were small children learning new things everyday! The wonderment of a small child... I see the little ones here at the congregation in Elizabethtown... looking around...taking things in! I see posts on Facebook of nephews, great nephews and nieces, and posts from those I know from various camps, and the little ones are so precious in the various ways they are growing! Though our girls are becoming young women, I still think fondly of the days when the new things they learned everyday were so basic.

I guess in one way this is a reason I love so much to teach and ponder on the basics of Christianity. Oh don't get me wrong, I love to dig deep into Scripture and consider truths that can impact my life, and the lives of others (if I live out those truths for others to see). But it is those basic elements, themselves so very deep, that are beautiful to consider!

Think first of the love of Deity for mankind! It is truly a love that is unable to be comprehended by us as humans. Scripture describes the love of Deity as the greatest love. "God so loved the world" and "God first loved us" is shown in many ways. Before the creation of the world and mankind, God loved us enough to create us. He knew we would reject Him and that rejection would necessitate the sending of His Son to die on our behalf. Is that not amazing to contemplate?

Think about the Church as well! Included in the plan to redeem mankind is the Church!
