## Confidence Comer John F. Board

In this week's *Confidence Comer* we want to examine the benefit for the Christian of studying the book of Proverbs. Though James provides us with a very practical book of wisdom in the New

Testament, Paul writes that "whatsoever things that were written aforetime, were written for our learning" (Rom. 15:4). Since this is the case, we can benefit greatly from a book of wisdom that comes from One who has always existed and thus has all wisdom and knowledge there is to know.

When you begin reading the book of Proverbs, the book itself, reveals a number of reasons why anyone who desires to follow God would benefit from His instruction. Consider just these few reasons of how the Proverbs serves those who seek to follow God:

1. They teach wisdom and self-control, giving true understanding
2. They will teach you how to be smart and self-controlled, whatever is honest and fair and right.
3. To those who have only a little knowledge they give the ability to think—knowledge and good sense to inexperienced young people.
4. A wise person should also listen to them and learn even more. Even very intelligent people will find prudent advice in these words.
5. Then they will be able to understand wise words—interpreting the words of wise men and their hidden meanings.

All Christians—whether old or young—can benefit from a study of the book of Proverbs. I am using this book as the basis for the morning devotion I do for Emaleigh while she is at FHU. In this way, I can learn as I study and write the devotional to her, and she can study and learn by reading the text and associated devotional. Who knows, maybe you too will at sometime do such a study.
